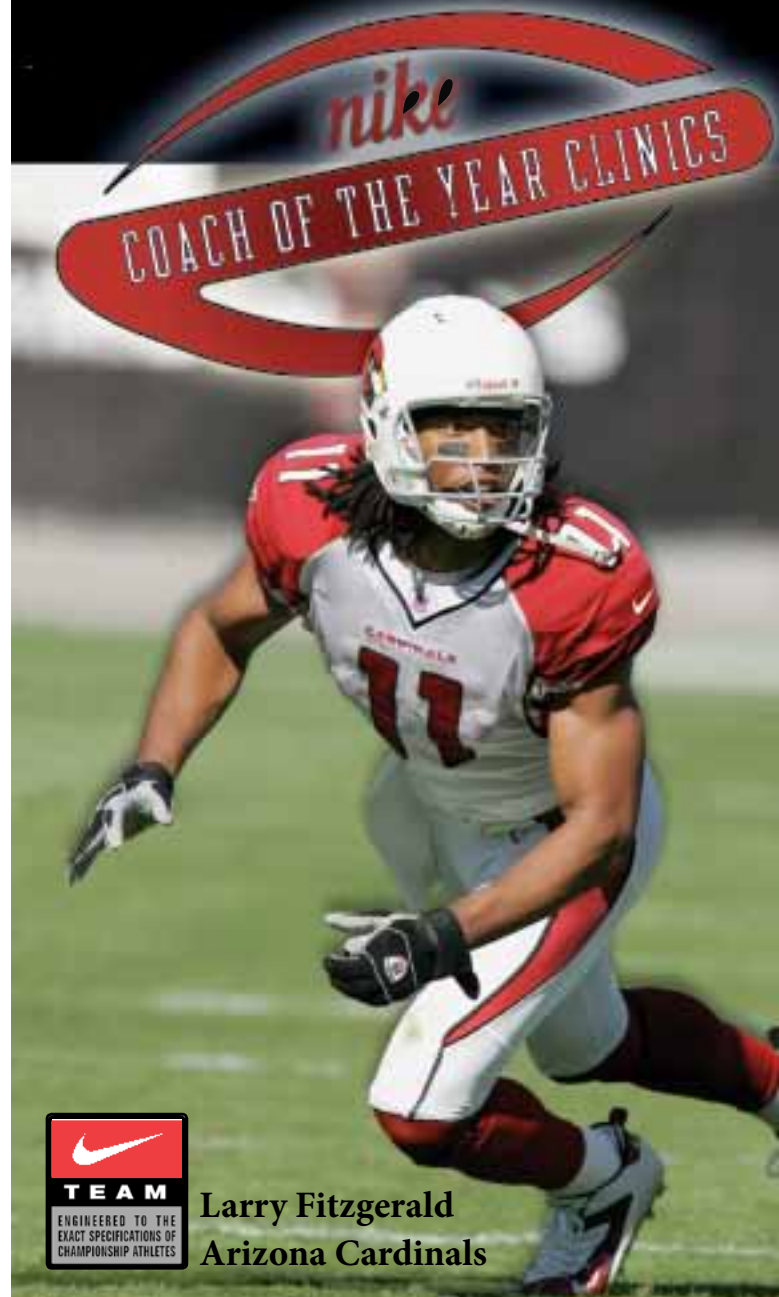

Bobby Bowden – Florida State

Coach Bowden—who coached at both Samford and West Virginia before arriving at Florida State—is currently ranked as the fourth winningest coach in the history of college football. He’s got two national championships and a stadium named in his honor. He’s already been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. Maybe most remarkably, the 79-year-old coach is still running the show in Tallahassee. The 2009 season will be his 33rd as Florida State’s head coach and he has an overall record of 382-123-4. Bowden boasts an impressive 20-8-1 record in bowl games. Only Joe Paterno, with 23, has more bowl wins. Coach Bowden’s Florida State teams have won 10 or more games 18 times. In fact Coach Bowden has won more games in Tallahassee than the previous seven coaches before him combined. In his three-decade run at Florida State, Bowden has coached 25 first-team Associated Press All Americans, 11 academic All Americans, two Heisman Trophy winners and sent more than 150 players to the NFL. He has won national acclaim as the ACC and National Coach of the Year 11 different times.



KEN NIUMATALOLO – United States Naval Academy

Navy head football coach Ken Niumatalolo had one of the most successful first seasons as a head coach in school history. He is the first coach to lead Navy to a bowl game in his inaugural season and, thanks to a 33-27 victory over Air Force and a 34-0 win over Army, he became just the second Service Academy coach to win the Commander-In-Chief’s Trophy in his first year. Prior to being named head coach, Niumatalolo had two coaching stints at the Naval Academy for a combined 10 seasons, including the last six where he served as assistant head coach and offensive line coach. Niumatalolo and the majority of his coaching staff have been part of a staff that has brought the Midshipmen back into the national spotlight with a 51-25 (.671) record over the last six seasons. During that time, Navy has made a school-record six-consecutive bowl game appearances, won six-consecutive Commander-In-Chief’s Trophies, earned 13-consecutive wins over the other two Service Academies and claimed an NCAA-record four-consecutive NCAA rushing titles.



DOUG MARRONE – Syracuse University

A graduate of Syracuse University, Coach Marrone, a former pro football player and successful coach in the Division I collegiate ranks and the National Football League, returned to his alma mater as the program’s 28th head coach in 2009. Marrone was a three-year letterman at Syracuse playing on the offensive line from 1983-1985. His coaching resume includes stints at Georgia, Georgia Tech and Tennessee. For the past three seasons, Marrone has been the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for the New Orleans Saints. The 2008 Saints lead the NFL in total offense (401.6 yards per game) and passing offense (304.2 yards per game). During his tenure, the Saints have been one of the NFL’s most explosive and consistent offenses, ranking among the league leaders since his arrival and rewriting the club’s all-time record book in the process. He began his coaching career in 1992 at Cortland (N.Y.) State as a tight ends coach before stints as offensive line coach at the U.S. Coast Guard Academy (1993) and Northeastern University (1994).



LARRY FEDORA – Southern Mississippi

Coach Fedora was introduced as head football coach of the Southern Miss program on Dec. 12, 2007; he came to Southern Miss after spending the previous three seasons as the Offensive Coordinator at Oklahoma State where the Cowboys have been in the top 10 in rushing yards per game and in the top 20 in total offense per game in each of the last two seasons. During Fedora’s three-year tenure at OSU, the Cowboys raised their rushing, passing and total offensive yards each year that he was there. In 2006, the Cowboys were one of just two teams - the other being Boise State - to average over 200 yards both rushing and passing. Known for his offensive prowess, the Golden Eagles did not disappoint in that facet of the game as they broke 36 school records and tied five more on offense. One of those offensive records included total yards, as the school tallied 5,636 yards in 2008. Southern Miss finished No. 20 in the country in total offense among Football Bowl Subdivision; the highest ever finish for the school in this category. The Golden Eagles finished as one of the hottest teams in Conference USA by winning their final five contests as the first-year head coach led his team to their seven-straight bowl appearance and 11th in the last 12 seasons.



AL GROH – University of Virginia

Entering his ninth year as the head football coach at Virginia, his alma mater, Groh has done a masterful job of not only making the program competitive on the national stage, he has helped change the environment and culture around the team so that the UVA Football Experience is one of the best in the nation. Coach Groh has been recognized during three of his first eight years at Virginia with coach of the year honors. He has been named the ACC Coach of the Year in 2002 & 2007 and the American Football Coaches Association’s Regional Coach of the Year in 2004. Groh has helped to create a bright, exciting atmosphere for the Virginia football Cavaliers.
